

Dear Chairman McDaniel:

We are pleased to present your community with Preliminary copies of the Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) and Flood Insurance Study (FIS) report for Gulf County, Florida and Incorporated Areas for your review and comment. The enclosed FIS report for Gulf County describes the flood hazard information updates made to the FIRM and FIS report and the source information used in making the updates. We have revised only those FIRM panels with updated flood hazard information.

We are sending the Preliminary copies at this time to give your community an opportunity to review them. Additionally, in an effort to assist you in circulating the information, FEMA has posted digital copies of the revised FIRM and FIS report materials online. To view Preliminary Flood Hazard Data, visit www.fema.gov/preliminaryfloodhazarddata.

We will contact you shortly to schedule a formal Preliminary DFIRM Community Coordination (PDCC) meeting to discuss the revised flood hazard information, ordinance adoption, and other frequently asked questions and concerns. In the meantime, we encourage you to circulate the enclosed copies as widely as possible among elected officials, staff, and other individuals or organizations in the community that would have an interest in the FIRM and FIS report so that they will have the opportunity to review them thoroughly before the formal community coordination meeting. The review period provides community officials and citizens in the affected communities with an opportunity to identify changes or corrections to non-technical information, such as corporate limits, road names, and stream names on the FIRM or in the FIS report. Comments may be sent to the Mapping Partner, c/o Mr. Jerrick Saquibal, P.E., CFM, Northwest Florida Water Management District, 81 Water Management Drive, Havana, FL 32333-4712. Please submit comments (digital format such as shapefiles preferred) no later than 30 days from the date of this letter. All comments and changes received during this review period will be incorporated, as appropriate, before the FIRM and FIS report become effective.

To assist your community in maintaining the FIRM, we have enclosed a Summary of Map Actions (SOMA) to document previous Letters of Map Change (LOMCs) (i.e., Letters of Map Amendment [LOMAs], Letters of Map Revision [LOMRs]) that will be superseded when the FIRM becomes effective. Information on LOMCs is presented in the following four categories: (1) LOMCs for which results have been included on the FIRM; (2) LOMCs for which results could not be shown on the FIRM because of scale limitations or because the LOMC issued had determined that the lots or structures involved were outside the SFHA as shown on the FIRM; (3) LOMCs for which results have not been included on the FIRM because the flood hazard information on which the original determinations were based is being

superseded by new flood hazard information; and (4) LOMCs issued for multiple lots or structures where the determination for one or more of the lots or structures cannot be revalidated through an administrative process like the LOMCs in Category 2 above.

LOMCs in Category 2 will be revalidated through a single letter that reaffirms the validity of a previously issued LOMC; the letter will be sent to your community shortly before the effective date of the FIRM and will become effective one day after the FIRM becomes effective.

For the LOMCs listed in Category 4, we will review the data previously submitted for the LOMA or LOMR request and issue a new determination for the affected properties after the FIRM becomes effective upon request.

Your community should be aware that recently approved LOMCs, specifically LOMRs, may have been issued for your community. The LOMR process is dynamic and FEMA is reviewing LOMR applications regularly. To complete production of the Preliminary FIRMs which includes incorporating the effects of "mappable" LOMRs issued since the last map effective date, a specific cutoff was established. FEMA will address any approved LOMRs issued after the cutoff date when the final SOMA is distributed. If your community has concerns regarding a specific case, please submit the LOMR case number, as well as any appropriate documentation, to our FEMA Regional Office at 3003 Chamblee-Tucker Road, Atlanta, Georgia 30341 before the end of the comment or appeal periods discussed below to assist us in keeping the map up to date.

After the PDCC Meeting, we will initiate a statutory 90-day appeal period for certain communities within Gulf County. A statutory 90-day appeal period is required when FEMA adds or modifies Base (1-percent-annual-chance) Flood Elevations (BFEs), base flood depths, SFHAs, flood zone designations, or regulatory floodways within a community, as shown on the Preliminary FIRM. If your community is identified as requiring an appeal period, we will send you a letter approximately 2 weeks before the start of the 90-day appeal period to detail the appeal process. The letter will forward information regarding notifications to be published in the FEDERAL REGISTER and local newspaper(s) and will provide the first and second publication dates. The appeal period will start on the second newspaper publication date. Additional information concerning the 90-day appeal period will be provided during the PDCC Meeting.

After the review and appeal periods have ended and we have addressed all comments/appeals, we will initiate final preparation of the FIRM and FIS report. The new FIRM and FIS report for your community will become effective approximately 7 to 10 months later. Before the effective date, you will be notified in writing of the official FIRM and FIS report effective date and asked to adopt floodplain ordinances or modify existing ordinances as necessary that correspond with the new FIRM or FIS report. If you or other community officials have any questions regarding floodplain ordinances, you may raise them with our FEMA Regional Office or you may discuss those issues with your State NFIP Coordinator. Several months before the effective date, we will mail one set of printed copies of the finalized FIRM and FIS report and digital copies of the map and report products.

Your community's comments on the Preliminary FIRM panels and FIS report are an important part of our review process, and we will consider them carefully before we publish the FIRM and FIS report in their final form. If you have any questions regarding the Preliminary copies of the FIRM and FIS report, please contact the Mitigation Division of FEMA in Region IV at 770-220-5406 and ask for the Regional Project Officer assigned to your community, for assistance. CODE ENFORCEMENT POLICY 2016 RELATING TO BUILDING CODE VIOLATIONS

Pursuant to F.S. 468.604 (2) any person engaged in enforcement of the Florida Building Code must be licensed as a building inspector in the appropriate category as defined in s.468.603. It shall be the responsibility of the Building Official to ensure that provisions of the code enforced. It is the policy of the Gulf County Building Department that all building related code enforcement complaints shall be forwarded to and handled by a licensed Building Inspector pursuant to F.S 468.604.

All non- building related code enforcement complaints shall be forwarded to and handled by the Gulf County Code Enforcement Officer. It is further noted that F.S 468.604 states that the Building Code Inspector's responsibilities must be performed under the direction of the Building Code Administrator or Building Official without interference from any unlicensed person.



Expiration of tax certificate: Seven (7) years after the date of issuance of a tax certificate, which is the date of the first day of the tax certificate sale as advertised under s. 197.432, if a tax deed has not been applied for, and no other administrative or legal proceeding, including a bankruptcy, has existed of record, the tax certificate is null and void and shall be canceled. The tax collector shall note the date of the cancellation upon all appropriate records in his or her office. This section does not apply to deferred payment of tax certificates.

**Longtime Bay County Health Department Administrator
Selected as Sapphire Awards Runner-up**

ORLANDO, Fla. – Douglas Kent of the Florida Department of Health in Bay County was selected as a 2016 Sapphire Award runner-up, winning \$20,000 for his work toward “100 percent access, 0 percent disparities” in health care over a 40-year career. He was selected from among 112 nominees statewide in three categories. The awards, presented by the Florida Blue Foundation totaling \$350,000, honor outstanding work by individuals, programs and nonprofit organizations in community health care, or health care-related fields, distinguished by leadership, innovation and achievements in community health. The honorees in each category were announced at the conclusion of the two-day Sapphire Symposium that featured community health experts from around the state and country.

Kent's achievements during his 40 years of public health service encompass many programs across Bay and Gulf counties. He is recognized for his experience, success, vision and diligence along with his ability to bring community leaders and partnerships together to join his vision and mission in improving public health issues. Bay scallop workshops scheduled May 24 and June 13

Two workshops to gather public input on this summer's bay scallop season in St. Joseph Bay are scheduled for Tuesday, May 24 and Monday, June 13. Both will be from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. EDT at the Capital City Bank conference room, 2nd floor, 504 Monument Ave., in Port St. Joe. At these meetings, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) will update the public on the most recent monitoring data as well as gather feedback about potential management options.

Ongoing research and monitoring results indicate bay scallops in Gulf County were negatively impacted during the 2015 red tide event in the area. The FWC will work closely with Gulf County in a coordinated and cooperative effort to minimize negative impacts associated with potential low scallop numbers this summer. In the meantime, FWC will proceed with previously planned research and monitoring activities, including monthly juvenile monitoring and annual adult monitoring that is conducted in early June. The June 13 meeting will include data from the annual preseason survey of adult scallop numbers.

Public input gathered at these workshops will be presented to the Commission at its June 22 – 23 meeting in the Apalachicola area, where the Commission will discuss what management actions are best suited to meet the needs of the fishery in Gulf County while recognizing and preserving the economic value of scallops to the area. Areas east of Gulf County do not appear to have been impacted. The 2016 bay scallop season is currently scheduled to open June 25.

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
