RE: Letter of Support/Port Theatre

Dear Mr. Bender:

The Gulf County Board of County Commissioners ("Commission") voted unanimously on October 14, 2014, to provide this letter of support to the Port Theatre Art & Culture Center ("PTACC"), for purchase assistance of the Port Theatre in Port St. Joe. The Board of Commissioners were advised that the PTACC had just entered into a contract for sale of the theater and is applying for the Special Categories Grant from the Florida Department of State, Division of Historic Resources to fund the purchase. The matching funds are being provided by the Port St. Joe Redevelopment Agency.

The Commission provides this letter of support as well as this brief history as provided by the PTACC. On June 20, 1938, the Port Theatre opened for its first movie presentation. It has been closed since the 1960's, with a limited exception as an auction house in the early 2000's. PTACC strives to unify the community in its effort to acquire, renovate, and reopen the theater. In June 2003, the Port Theatre was officially listed in the National Register of Historic Places. The Theatre has remained essentially dormant since the 1960's. While the integrity of the walls is largely intact, the roof and all interior systems, finishes, and components are deteriorating. Without rehabilitation, the building will deteriorate beyond reasonable expectation of recovery.

The BOCC supports the PTACC in the reopening of the Theatre that will breathe new life into the downtown area and provide a gathering place for the community and region. A thriving art and culture community exists in Port St. Joe in spite of having no home venue; the nearest theater is 25 miles away. Tourism is the primary industry of the region, and an entertainment and cultural venue will enhance the tourist experience and increase the economic benefit of tourism. The vision for the Theatre is a revitalization that honors the legacy of the theatre, a multi-use facility that will serve the community in a multitude of ways and will appeal to all age groups, a cultural hub for the community, programming to unite families, a tourist attraction, a showcase for local talent, and a place to be inspired, and have fun.

The Special Category Grant through the Bureau of Historic Preservation Grant Program and matching funds from the Port St. Joe Redevelopment Agency will purchase the building. A six-year phasing program will enable fundraising and additional grant applications to fund a portion of the renovation each year, allowing for partial opening of the venue after year one. The community will also provide funds through donations of individuals, businesses, and foundations.

The Commission supports the PTACC in its efforts for the purchase, renovation and re-purposing of the Port Theatre as discussed above. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me at any time.

GULF COUNTY COMMITTEE TERM LIMIT POLICY (6/21/04) AMENDMENT:

The current Gulf County Committee term limit policy is amended to permit a current committee/advisory board member serving at the Gulf County Commission's appointment who has completed two consecutive terms to be eligible for re-appointment to that committee for an additional term and/or terms only upon the unanimous vote and approval of the County Commission following proper introduction, application and request of that member.

Pursuant to the direction of this Commission at its regular meeting of October 14, 2014 and following the review and analysis of the current Gulf County procedures for surplus tangible property owned by this County in conjunction with a review and consideration of Florida Statute, the following policy is being submitted for this Board's review, consideration and discussion. Following this Board's review and discussion of this Gulf County Surplus Property Policy and thereafter any public discussion or comment in accordance with county ordinance no. 2013-07, it is the recommendation that this Board consider the following for approval and adoption.

PURPOSE:

To set forth authority, policy and procedures for the proper surplus of county owned tangible property valued over and under \$5,000.

UPDATES:

Future updates to this policy will be the responsibility of the Commission upon final adoption of any amendments by the Board of County Commissioners.

AUTHORITY:

Florida Statute, Section 125.01.

Florida Statute, Section 274.06: *Property, the value of which the governmental unit estimates to be under \$5,000, may be disposed of in the most efficient and cost effective means as determined by the governmental unit.*

....Any sale of property the value of which the governmental unit estimates to be \$5,000 or more shall be sold only to the highest responsible bidder, or by public auction, after proper statutory notice.

GULF COUNTY SURPLUS OF TANGIBLE PROPERTY POLICY:

I. PROCEDURE FOR SURPLUS OF PROPERTY (< \$5,000):

Tangible property owned by Gulf County valued by the County under \$5,000 shall be disposed of in the most efficient and cost-effective means as determined by the Commission pursuant to F.S. 274.06. Accordingly, the request to surplus tangible property owned by Gulf County with estimated value less than \$5,000 shall be introduced before the Commission by the County Administrator or departmental head.

With the authorizing vote of the Commission, the County shall commence with the following procedure for the efficient and cost-effective process to surplus tangible property under the stated value.

- a. Introduction (verbal or written) of a request for surplus and sale of the tangible property by the County Administrator or departmental head at County Commission public meeting. Included with the request from the staff will be confirmation of the estimated value of the property to be less than \$5,000.
- b. Upon authorizing vote of the Commission, the staff shall commence with the following advertisement and posting:
 1. An appropriate description of the property shall be posted on the County Administration building (location at the entrance where public notices are customarily posted) for a period no less than 10 calendar days.
 2. The same description shall be placed on the Gulf County website <http://gulfcounty-fl.gov> for the same period as stated in the notice.
 3. The posting and description shall clearly state the date and time upon which the County Clerk to the Commission shall cease receiving sealed bids in their office, Gulf County Clerk of Court, 1000 Cecil Costin Blvd, Port St. Joe, Florida 32456, for the described property.
 4. The sealed bids shall be opened by County staff and the appropriate bid tabulation sheet assembled and prepared for the Commission's review and direction.
- c. The Commission during a regular public meeting shall review and direct staff to accept a qualified highest bidder or in the alternative reserve the right to reject all bids submitted.

II. PROCEDURE FOR SURPLUS OF PROPERTY (>\$5,000) :

Tangible property owned by Gulf County valued by the County over \$5,000 shall be disposed of by the sale to the highest responsible bidder, or by public auction, after publication of notice not less than 1 week nor more than 2 weeks prior to sale in a newspaper having a general circulation in Gulf County pursuant to Florida Statute 274.06.

III. ALTERNATIVE PROCEDURES:

- a. The Commission reserves the right upon recommendation of staff to elect to lawfully dispose of surplus property deemed obsolete, uneconomical or inefficient without bids to the state, another governmental unit or political subdivision pursuant to Florida Statute 274.06.
- b. If the property is determined by the County to be without commercial value it may also be donated, destroyed, or abandoned upon authorizing vote of the Commission.


