

The Department has received your re-evaluation of the environmental findings previously approved by the Department on September 25, 2010. Based on the documentation submitted in support of the Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI), it appears that the review was properly conducted and therefore is consistent with 24 CFR Part 58.47.

The new scope of work consists of constructing up to 890 LF of rock revetment to include the 275 LF originally proposed in addition to the 615 LF classified as unaddressed need. This letter has been sent to inform you of the proposed upcoming resurfacing project on State Road (S.R.) 30. Since there will not be a public information meeting, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) would like to give you the opportunity to ask questions and/or submit comments concerning the project. This project includes roadway resurfacing, utilizing multiple pavement test sections. The estimated construction cost on this 2.9 mile project is \$650,000. The FDOT is scheduled to accept bids in May 2012 with construction anticipated to begin in September 2012. Construction duration is anticipated to be 60 days.

Although this project will not require right-of-way, the FDOT is required to give notice to those whose property lies, in whole or in part, within 300 feet on either side of the centerline of the proposed facility even though they may not be directly affected. Similar notices have been sent to all other potentially affected property owners in your neighborhood. Public participation is solicited without regard to race, color, national origin, age, sex, religion, disability or family status.



This letter is in response to Gulf County's (Subgrantee) first appeal of Project Worksheet (PW) 14. The Subgrantee has appealed the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) decision to deny funding for sand replacement expenses to restore St. Joseph Peninsula Beach. The amount in dispute for this appeal is \$15,113,160.

Due to the effects of Hurricane Gustav (FEMA-1806-DR-FL), a four-mile section of the engineered beach at St. Joseph Peninsula was extensively damaged. FEMA prepared PW 14 to document the damages and scope of work required to restore the beach to its maintained, pre-disaster profile. Because the entire beach restoration project is located in an area protected by the Coastal Barrier Resources Act (CBRA), Public Law 97-348, FEMA engaged the Department of Interior, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) in consultation. As a result of the consultation, the USFWS found that the restoration work was inconsistent with the purposes of the CBRA. FEMA concurred with the findings of USFWS and denied funding for the restoration project.

In its first appeal, both the Subgrantee and the Florida Division of Emergency Management (Grantee) assert that the proposed beach restoration project is consistent with CBRA. The Grantee further states that FEMA's denial is inconsistent with the intent of CBRA as the denial would cause the Subgrantee to increase property tax revenue through further development in the area. Additionally, the Grantee contends that approval of the project is within FEMA's authority pursuant to 44 CFR §206.345 (b).

In accordance with 44 CFR §206.344(c), FEMA may not provide funding for units within the Coastal Barrier Resources System (CBRS) "except as provided in §206.345 and §206.346." This limitation applies to projects designed to "prevent the erosion of, or to otherwise stabilize, any inlet, shoreline, or inshore area, except... in cases where an emergency threatens life, land, and property immediately adjacent to that unit." Exceptions to the aforementioned provisions listed at 44 CFR §206.345(b) (6) state that "after consultation with the Secretary of the Interior, the Regional

Administrator may make disaster assistance available within the CBRS for the following types of actions, provided such assistance is consistent with the purposes of CBRA...for repair of nonstructural projects for shoreline stabilization that are designed to mimic, enhance, or restore natural stabilization systems." According to the information received from the Subgrantee and the results of FEMA's consultation with USFWS, the Subgrantee has not provided documentation to support its assertion that the repairs to the beach at St. Joseph Peninsula meet the exception standards listed in the aforesaid Regulation. Consequently, FEMA's initial determination that the project was not consistent with the purposes of CBRA is warranted. Accordingly, the appeal is denied.

Please inform the Subgrantee of this decision and its right to a second appeal pursuant to 44 CFR §206.206. If you have any questions, please contact Mr. Jesse F. Munoz, CEM, Director, Recovery Division, at (770) 220-5300.

On May 19, 2011, April Groover of our staff met with representatives of your community to monitor the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) project identified above. This letter, which contains no “findings” and no “concerns,” is a summary of that visit. Monitoring is based on an examination of documentation that supports the grant Recipient’s compliance with the grant agreement, state statutes, and federal regulations. We monitored the following areas for compliance.

- Audit Review
- Financial Management System Review
- Labor Standards
- Buy American
- Procurement
- Program Administration

Following is a summary of the areas examined and the results of the monitoring.

**Audit Review**

### **Financial Management System Review**

We reviewed the Financial Management System to ensure compliance with requirements for fund control, cost allowability and accountability stated as identified in OMB Circulars A-21, A-87, A122 and other applicable regulations. In reviewing the Recipient's record-keeping system, we examined documentation that the grant funds were incorporated into the Recipient's annual operating budget; reviewed how accounting records, including case receipts and disbursement ledgers were maintained; checked for evidence that duties were segregated; established whether the request for funds file was complete; and ensured compliance with audit procedures.

### **Labor Standards**

Project progress was compared to the Scope of Work to determine on-time performance and expenditures. If non-grant funds were pledged in the application, we reviewed the amount expended to date. If program income was generated, its disposition was examined.

There were no findings or concerns.

### **Procurement**

GEO-funded grants, including grant modifications, must comply with applicable federal procurement regulations and state laws. The principal federal procurement regulation is contained in 10 CFR 600.236. Procurement of certain professional services is also subject to 287.055, Florida Statutes, (also known as the Consultants Competitive Negotiation Act, or CCNA). No breach of statutory, regulatory, or contractual provisions was noted under this area during the visit.

There were no findings or concerns.



ORDER APPROVING REVISED STANDARD OFFER CONTRACT AND RELATED  
TARIFFS

BY THE COMMISSION:

**I. Case Background**

Since January 1, 2006, each investor owned electric utility (IOU) has been required to continuously offer to purchase capacity and energy from specific types of renewable resources. Section 366.91(3), Florida Statutes (F.S.), specifies that the contracts for purchase must be based on the utility's full avoided cost as defined in Section 366.051, F.S., and provide a term of at least ten years. Rules 25-17.200 through 25-17.310, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), implement the statutes.

Progress Energy Florida, Inc. (PEF) filed its petition for approval of amended standard offer contract on April 1, 2011. The contract, as directed by Rule 25-17.250, F.A.C., is based on PEF's 2011 Ten-Year Site Plan.

We have jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Sections 366.04 through 366.06, 366.91, and 366.92, F.S.

**II. Analysis**

Because PEF is an IOU, Rule 25-17.250(1), F.A.C., requires it to continuously make available a standard offer contract for the purchase of firm capacity and energy from renewable generating facilities and small qualifying facilities with a design capacity of 100 kilowatts (kW) or less. In its 2011 Ten-Year Site Plan, PEF has identified a 178 megawatt (MW) gas-fired combustion turbine as its next fossil fueled generating unit. The in-service date of the unit is projected to be June 1, 2020.

A renewable generator can elect to have no performance requirements to deliver energy on an as-available basis under the current standard offer. If the renewable generator commits to certain performance requirements based on the avoided unit, including being on-line and delivering capacity by the in-service date, it can receive a capacity payment. To promote renewable generation, we require multiple options for capacity payments, including the option to receive Early or Levelized payments.

If a renewable generator elects to receive payments under the Normal or Levelized options, it would receive as-available energy rates until June 1, 2020, the in-service date of the avoided unit. If the Early or Early Levelized options are selected, capacity payments begin at an earlier date but tend to be less in the outer years as the net present value of payments must remain the same. In addition, capacity payments greater than those made under the Normal option require additional performance security from the renewable generator. Table 1 estimates the annual payments that would be made to a renewable facility of 50 MW running at a 94 percent capacity factor, with an in-service date of 2012.

PEF submitted a total of 13 revised tariff sheets, including 8 revised sheets of the standard offer contract and 5 revised sheets corresponding to Rate Schedule COG-2. All of the revised sheets pertain to the date of the avoided unit, economic parameters, or document formatting. Beyond these revisions, all other terms, such as provisions for performance, payment, and security are retained from the 2010 standard offer contract and related tariffs.

**III. Decision**

The provisions of the 2011 standard offer contract and related tariffs submitted by PEF conform to all requirements of Rules 25-17.200 through 25-17.310, F.A.C. The standard offer contract provides flexibility in the arrangements for payments so that a developer of renewable generation may select the payment stream best suited to its financial needs. We hereby approve the standard offer contract and related tariffs submitted by PEF as filed.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that Progress Energy Florida, Inc.'s standard offer contract and related tariffs are hereby approved, effective June 14, 2011. It is further


